We Canceve Movement Exceeds Goal of 100 Donated Easter Baskets This Year

(Abingdon, Md.) – This year alone, the We Canceve Movement donated 146 Eggstra Special Easter baskets to area homeless, sick and foster children, bringing the grand total since 2012 to date to 318.

Annually, brand-new baskets are stuffed with assorted candy, snacks, and art, craft or toy but this year, baskets were customized with cosmetics and other toiletries for teenage girls living at an area residential group home.

For the first time, We Canceve donated baskets to Anna's House, which offers transitional and permanent housing for homeless women and their children in Harford County, and Eastside Family Emergency Shelter, an all-inclusive resource to help stabilize the homeless of Baltimore County through case management, rapid re-housing programs, aftercare coordination, and a Samaritan Housing Program for the chronically homeless.

Members of the board of advisors rallied friends and families to support this year massive giveaway. One board member, Alexis Bell, sponsored 10 baskets that were donated to the University of Maryland Upper Chesapeake Medical Center. Bell and her family delivered the baskets on March 26. Sarah Beall and her family delivered 50 baskets on March 25 to the Eastside Family Emergency Shelter in Rosedale. Gabriel Nozea and his family delivered 39 baskets on April 1 to the Harford Family House in Aberdeen. Grace Callwood delivered 18 baskets on March 19 to Arrow Family Ministries, for teen girls living in residential foster care group home in Churchville; 11 baskets on March 26 to Sinai Hospital Hematology/Oncology Clinic in Baltimore and 18 baskets on March 30 to Anna's House Transitional and Permanent Housing for Homeless woman and children.

The We Canceve Movement is a nonprofit organization that creates giving opportunities that can be supported by the community to bring happiness to homeless, sick and foster children. It was founded in 2011
