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## 10-Year-Old Charity Founder Only Child Nominated for Harford Most Beautiful People Award

(Bel Air, Md.) – Grace E. G. Callwood, age 10, was named the youngest person nominated for the Harford Most Beautiful People Award this year for her volunteer efforts that benefit homeless, sick and foster children.

Callwood, along with about 40 adults, was recognized October 2 in a county ceremony at the Bel Air Church of the Nazarene. Each year, Harford County conducts a search for local “unsung heroes” who selflessly assist those around them. They are volunteers of any age whose acts of goodwill have previously gone unnoticed. 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The charity was founded in 2011 by Callwood when she was a pediatric oncology patient. She completed chemotherapy in April 2014 and remains cancer free.

The mission of the We Cancerve Movement is to represent and inspire a beloved community formed by persons who come together swiftly to support initiatives that result in giving opportunities that bring happiness to homeless, sick and foster children.

To date, the charity has donated 172 Easter Baskets to area sick, homeless and foster children and has provided more than \$1,100 in cash grants to Sinai Hospital and Casey Cares Foundation. In addition, the charity has donated nearly 150 new and like-new back-to-school clothes to homeless youth; more than 150 TransFUNers kits to help hospitalized children decorate their IV poles; more than 140 pounds of school supplies to children in Maryland and Kenya, East Africa; and amassed almost 150 community service hours. This is just a sample of the charity's service to hundreds of homeless, sick and foster children.

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
